Chair MacKenzie went through the process for a public hearing, and read the rules from the back of the agenda.

**Public Hearing – Review
Conditional Use Permit
for Kirtland Products**

Meeder asked to recues herself due to a conflict of interest with the applicant, as there is an business economic partnership. Left at 5:03 pm.

Planning Director McPherson read his staff report that was in the agenda packet. In summary, after the start up in November of 2011, it quickly became apparent that the noise produced by the plant exceeded the expected levels and Kirtland did not appear to be in compliance with the conditional use permit. Many complaints were received from citizens on noise and stack emissions and odor issues, and Kirtland representatives quickly acknowledged the fact that the noise produced by the plant exceeded their expectations and implemented measures to reduce the noise with limited effect. A citizen committee was formed to address the noise and stack emissions/odor concerns, and a consultant was retained to review the noise issues. While an emissions consultant has not been retained, the citizen committee did submit a list of questions to the DEQ and requested additional emission modeling be completed; those questions and answers were included in the agenda packet. Resource Systems Group (RSG) completed their noise study in May of 2012 and made recommendations for mitigation. It was noted during the tests the operational sound levels ranged from 5 to 13 db higher than the background levels. Consistent with the sound abatement measures contained in Kirtland's proposal and the approved development plan for the conditional use, the mitigation

recommendations included in the RSG report indicated that all of the above noted equipment should be in a building. The report recommended that heavy concrete masonry structures be constructed around all of the above noted equipment. The RSG report also indicated that the two existing enclosures that contain the Air Power Unit M-D5009 and the Air Power Unit 6" were ineffective and recommended those structures be rebuilt.

As per section 2.70(G)(4) the conditional use for Kirtland Products is being referred back to the Planning Commission for review to make a determination on compliance with the conditional use permit. Section 2.70(G)(4) is as follows:

The Planning Director shall make periodic investigations of developments authorized by conditional use approval to determine continued compliance with all requirements imposed by the Planning Commission. Noncompliance with the requirements and conditions approved for the conditional use shall constitute grounds for the Planning Commission to terminate the approval following a public hearing. Such hearing shall be held in accordance with the procedures used for the original hearing as required by this Ordinance.

After investigation of the development as authorized by the conditional use approval for Kirtland Products, the conditional use is being referred back to the Planning Commission as per section 2.70(G)(4) for the following reasons:

Representations and information provided by Kirtland Products to the Planning Commission in regards to the impacts of the plant on which the approval of the conditional use permit was considered were incomplete and/or inaccurate;

Sound produced by the plant exceeds levels represented to the Planning Commission;

The sound abatement and landscaping measures as proposed by Kirtland and approved for the conditional use final site plan have not been completed as all equipment exceeding 40dB was not placed inside the building and landscaping as shown and described in the final approved development plan has not been installed.

Public Hearing was opened at 5:19 pm

Joe Quandt 412 S. Union St. Traverse City - responded on behalf of Kirtland Products, LLC. He introduced Leon Tupper, Mike Lange, and Tom Monley, senior management for the company. The company has remained engaged in the remediation of the noise concerns, and wants to be a good neighbor of the community. From our legal prospective, once the site plan or development plan has been approved, everything legally coalesces into those approval documents. We believe the zoning permit, does not have any conditions attached, and all conditions imposed have been met. All equipment was moved inside, and are attempting to implement all of the remedial conditions recommended by Kodiak Company, and the last piece of equipment is being retrofitted now. We believe in the balance of the benefits the plant provides in jobs and the public concerns, the company is trying to do something about it, and ask to have the issue tabled in order to conduct additional evaluations. The company is in full compliance with the DEQ emissions report: Part 55 Air Pollution Standards for particulate, odors, and dust management.

Tim Arner – 701 Alice St. - Live approximately 1 mile from Kirtland, and have since 1984. This issue is not about jobs, it is about a zoning dispute, and compatible land use. I first heard the noise this spring, an unrelenting nasty oscillating component, which was very annoying. I have become used to the neighborhood noises, these ambient noises are not constant, but intermittent; however, when Kirtland is running they are constant and upsetting. I can not enjoy my deck at night, or Avalanche Trail. Location, wind and weather can be a factor; this is about what level of noise is reasonable to a resident, who should not have to sacrifice their peace and enjoyment. It is not fair to those people who have to listen to it or are affected by it. I compliment Kirtland for their movement, however, the process is very slow, and I'm not sure of what improvements have been made, as I don't know if they have run much in the last month, so kind of hard to gauge.

Emily Jones – 1124 Nordic Dr. - Live approximately 1,000 feet from Kirtland, home was purchased 11 years ago. It has had a negative impact on our lives. Constant noise and multiple nights we wake up because of it. Sound echoes though out the house. The new fixed sound is like a helicopter constantly running outside. I have spent a significant amount of time at home due to my pregnancy. I would have to pack up the baby and go to my parents outside of town to get away from the noise and smell. My eyes and lungs are burning, so can not enjoy the out doors. A cloud of sawdust blowing from the plant, what do these affects have on an infant? Asking the board to revoke the conditional use permit based on the statements that were made in the November 2008 application. I do want jobs in Boyne City, but not at the expense of health and well being of the citizens. If no action is taken, our family may move from the community.

Ian Mitchell – 327 E. Cedar St. - Read his letter that was distributed to the members of the Planning Commission. Since Kirtland began its operations, the safety of my family has diminished due to the emissions in our yard and surrounding neighborhoods, and when the children are outside playing while attending schools. If they continue, our obligation to guard the health of our children will compel us to move to a community nearby, and take our Boyne based earnings to that other community.

Leslie Pritchard – 526 N. Lake St., and own 70 acres outside of town in Evangeline Township. - Have been following these issues in the media, I want to speak in support of Kirtland. We have opened our doors to the Industrial Park to create jobs. I respect concerns from the other residents over health and safety concerns, but the smells have been addressed by the DEQ. Well aware of smells and sounds coming from East Jordan when the winds are such that the Iron Works comes over our town, and I don't think they want to close them down. Kirtland has made efforts to comply and be a good neighbor. Our town was founded by the timber industry. Hearing all the sounds of the bands performing or practicing, the traffic on M 75, and even when the bars close down, these are part of living in our vibrant community.

Ron Crozier – 1121 Crozier Crest - My family has been in Boyne City for 5 generations, I live on the hill behind McDonalds. I hear nothing, smell nothing, and my windows are open all the time.

Ryan Giem – Boice St. - live 3/8th of a mile from the plant, for 14 years. No one is here to argue that you are below the DEQ levels in water vapor. Every emission has some level of risk, the concern is legitimate with a campus of 1200 kids, and I know those are emotions. You paid a lot of money to obtain facts, and as my background is principally a vibrations engineer I know that vibrations operate on waves and noise follows the same principles. Ambient noise is what is known as "white noise" it comes and goes and is a part of a small community. The overall level difference of 5 to 13 dB are not a lot, however, for every 10 dB it is a

"doubling" of perceived noise. Levels are pretty close, why? They were averaged levels. The wind graphs show the wind was quite during testing. When they did the ambient testing, the wind was blowing 10 to 15 mph. The ambient testing levels affected by the wind, microphones are placed in the trees by foliage, and can affect it. Near the Shell station, the road noise could be a large factor of the ambient noise. The 125 hertz and 250 hertz frequencies, were always more than a 10 dB difference and as you get further away from the plant difference between ambient and absolute don't change.

Tom Earhardt – Northern Lake Economic Alliance – organization assists businesses and helps to grow economy in Northern Michigan. Worked with Kirtland before and after they opened. The top management are concerned about the community, want to make things right, and want to add value and be apart of the community. There is alot of support within the Industrial Complex but they have chosen not to speak out. My office is less than 300 feet from Kirtland, and in the past few days have noticed a large decrease in the lower level noises. I commend the City of Boyne City for working with businesses and encouraging economic growth.

Don Nessen – 316 Boice St. - 1/3 of a mile from the plant. This town had a lot of pollution when the Tannery was open, they got rid of that, lost hundreds of jobs, but the town made it.

Jim Baumann – Executive Director of Boyne Area Chamber of Commerce - Ask to give Kirtland more time, RSG report came out just a couple of months ago, began mitigation right away, the preliminary DEQ results are in, final results are coming. Lets give them a change to finish what has been started, and get the full testing results. We need to work with them a little while longer.

April Marshall – visiting her mother from Newfoundland - I could hear the noise and do not like it, mom lives across the street. Believes that people don't want to live here with the noise and smells.

Mark Kowalske – Fall Park Rd. – Couple invested in a closed grocery store business near the plant. Due to the smells is this where a grocery store should be? We invested everything we had, just like Kirtland, and ask you keep this in mind.

Ryan Giem - I'm just trying to understand the difference in the ambient and operational noise levels when they are running. Pay attention to the 125 and 250 hertz frequencies, those are the ones that you hear and are annoying. These are the ones that go through structures. Remember that 10dB is doubling of perceived sound. The wind last night picked up a lot of ambient noise so that I could not hear the plant running, when I shut my slider door, I could hear the 125 hertz noises. We are not anti Kirtland, or anti jobs, or anti Boyne City we would like to be able to close our doors and sleep at night.

Kurt Rolland – Springwater Beach Rd. – Asked the board if they have been to the sites or been in their homes, to hear and experience what they are talking about? Amazed at how loud the noise was, to live in that situation, you would question what was going on.

Joe Jones – 1124 Nordic Dr. – The most recent fixes from my perspective the slow oscillation has changes, but has not gone away, just sped up, and I haven't noticed any dB decrease.

Chris Whittet – 1115 Boyne Summit – I have been taking dB readings from February until recently, before changes it was 47 – 53 db last week it was 45 to 54dB, no change in volume, maybe in the sound itself, but not volume. Can't get away from it. Just need it to stop.

Mindy Startzel – 427 High St. - Several people have asked me lately if Kirtland has been running. I know people who live out on M75 and work at Lexamar that were unable to hear any noise after the changes. Is this being told to the public? Do they

report the positive and not just the negative? I have never seen the particulates and dust on the green transformers. Smoke smell for three days, a brush fire was being burned nearby. School enrollment is up this year.

Mike Cummings – I started the first petition, so you could hear the silent majority in this city. We agree there is a sound and noise problem, and a smell problem has developed, what worried us is we read in the paper that it was to close that plant, and pull their permit. They have sympathy for the people who are hurting; we are asking to not close the plant. 1985 it was declared an Industrial Park, awhile back it was changed to a Business Park. Give them a continuation; it is not going to be fixed in a short period of time. What would it do to pull the permit and shut them down? We can afford to give them extra time.

Joe Quandt – We appreciate all of the comments, however, most of the negative comments have been subjective, except Mr. Giem's, who has an engineering degree. We have looked at the graphs and as RSG is the expert, they would know how to "balance" what ambient sound is and sound from other circumstances. Kurt Childs, Air quality manager with DEQ visited the facility and stated the odors were barely deductible at 7.29% opacity on a scale range between 5 – 15%. All scientific, reliable and objective documentation presented, none of the readings taken have exceeded the EPA guidelines and other community guidelines. We are looking for objective criteria. Company is willing to sit down and put together an objective criteria in respect to noise level ranges based on certain distances from the plant. You have a general nuisance standard that applies to Boyne City that is subjective. Look at all of the documents; believe the zoning permit does not have any conditions, other than the approved site plan has to be recognized. The administrative record has no specific criteria that it relies on except berm for trees which will be planted this fall and production equipment inside, which it is. Those are the criteria that are relevant.

James Kozlowski – Board member – Earlier you stated the agreements and all the minutes have no bearing on the Conditional Use findings; is that correct?

Quandt – No, everything coalesces into the actual conditions. The dialog between the parties is not apart of the permit. The planning commission's job is to evaluate the permit itself, and determine if the conditions have been satisfied with the findings of fact. The issue of whether the facility is in compliance is based on the final documents.

With no further comments from the public or clarification for the board members, the public hearing was closed at 6:23 pm

Board Deliberation

MacKenzie – Scott, anything you would like to add?

McPherson – Nothing specific other than the board needs to do two different things:

- 1) Determine if they are they in compliance with the conditional use permit?
- 2) Based on that, determine what you are going to do about it.

Ellwanger – Sympathetic to both sides, the noise is upsetting. Kirtland is working hard to get rid of the noise. Read the RSG report summary and suggestions, and some things haven't gotten done that were promised. Would like some of these things implemented.

MacKenzie – RSG report came from the committee, it was a list of items that could be done to help reduce the noise, but Kirtland was not required to follow.

Ellwanger – If we hired them, I would like to see some of these suggestions implemented to get some resolution to the problems. You stated that the dB would not be higher than 24; and we know that is not true. We would like to work with you.

St. Dennis - Zoning Ordinance and Planning Board is suppose to protect. Kirtland has made progress, but comes back to thinking Carters Building, St. Matthews and that area would be affected, not surrounding residential areas so far away. Very concerned about property values and health. Sites and sounds. Took the man at his initial word. Sound is getting better, I guess, but still an awful lot of concerns and problems.

Kozlowski – 24 dB, the noise is higher than that. It was the number discussed and you tried to achieve. Some of the conditions, in the findings of fact, public health, safety and welfare stated that the standards have been met and was completed. There are still some issues out there. Property values have changed; don't want to see people move away, that is an issue. Environmental stack emissions, we know nothing about findings, dealing with facts right now at this time. Referenced landscaping and the steps to take care of that. Sound was the big issue findings described how that was going to be achieved and the mechanical equipment; in my eyes they haven't been resolved at this time.

Frasz – I appreciate the challenge on both sides and the emotion. We have to get to an objective way to review. Are they in compliance with the conditional use permit that was granted? Yes or No. If yes, then they are; if not at what point and what discussion needs to be held to help identify ways to eventually get there.

Crum – I'm in closer agreement with Chris. How do you get to the objective criteria? It is doable, like some of the others, we should allow more time, and not take it lightly to revoke the permit. I rely on the expert findings. We do have some preliminary. They have gone above and beyond the original conditional use, and it raises more questions that came after some of this. I certainly would not want to revoke the permit at this time

Ellwanger - If asked the question are they in compliance, I would say no, do we need to give more time? I think we should. The area residents are getting frustrated. I don't want to see 30 jobs lost. I am leaning towards giving them an additional shot at it.

Neidhamer – In the spirit of the conditional use permit, I would find that they are not in compliance based on fact that when they said all equipment exceeding 40dB would be inside a de coupled wall building and it is not, I agreed when they said the loudest noise would be the backup beeper on the loader, and not louder than Lexamar, I believed those items are a part of the conditional use permit. I too appreciate the spirit of cooperation, and from day one, said we can solve this. Recommendations by Kodiak in the last two weeks, have improved, but you can still hear the sounding in the walls from the people affected.

McCahan – There is a lot of blame to go around. In 2008, in the midst of a huge recession, believed that 60 or 70 jobs would be brought to the community, gave the benefit of the doubt to most items stated, instead of looking further. Maybe the plant should not have been located there; however it was not heavy industry. Let's try to make it work. They indicated they would abate the noise in 2008 & 2009, and it sounded good. Only after the plant was up and running did they admit that it was more than they anticipated, and they are trying to fix it. There is more that could and should be done. I also understood equipment that was louder than 40dB would be put in a decoupled building or placed inside, and as the RSG report states, there are still six pieces of equipment out side, you are not bound by that, but you are bound by the permit that stated noise would be abated. It is the 125/250 hertz low frequency sounds that go through the structures. Conditional Use Permit was

issued based on the assertions made, property values would not decrease. I really believe, although hard to prove, that there are a lot of values decreased in the residential neighborhoods. If you fix the noise, and get rid of the low frequency vibrations you are going to solve the problem, and everyone will be happy. The vapor, VOC, and particulates, we need to wait for the final reports, but if the DEQ say all is ok there is nothing that we can do. They are the experts. There is more that can be done on the noise issue, the low frequency noises have got to be fixed. I believe also they are not in compliance, and we should give them more time, how much; I'm not sure. Progress has been made, we need to see more and get rid of the noise.

MacKenzie – I agree about the low frequency sounds. You hear no other ambient sounds like the crickets or the breeze, that low frequency is the noise you hear. Concur with what others have said. They are not in compliance, but would like to give them time to achieve, as they are working towards a solution. Is further testing the next step, what are the objective criteria? More time for modifications, get testing results, and do further sound testing.

St. Dennis - If the DEQ said it is alright, it was a stretch to bring to the community, so close to church and schools. We were told that it would be very clean out of the stacks.

MacKenzie – DEQ has done their tests, and are waiting for the written report.

Crum – Would the DEQ not be an objective criteria? We are talking about setting a standard and moving forward, we need to agree on what the standard will be.

St. Dennis – We've talked a lot about the noise, what about the smell? Are they going to do more or are they maxed out in getting rid of the vapor or smell?

McPherson – I don't believe they have any additional plans beyond the DEQ requirements, but are bound by our performance standards which do cover nuisances which talk about odor, dust, particulates and smoke. It is a very difficult thing to prove something maybe objectionable to one, but not to someone else.

McCahan – DEQ did present answers to the citizen committee's questions about limits to organic compounds, and when they did the stack tests the preliminary report on the VOC does show they are within the limits. Particulate matter is unknown at this time. May find that out with the final report.

Quandt – The company is willing to try to meet any objective standards. The air quality issues, the MDEQ has exclusive jurisdiction with the Air Pollution Control Act. Have your consultants and ours come up with what is the objective criteria that can be measured and reasonably based. The company is looking for a way to mitigate the problems through objective criteria.

Neidhamer – I believe we have some black and white items we can rule on.

McPherson – The conditional use permit is clear. I disagree that the zoning permit was issued with no conditions; it was issued to be in compliance with all of the original approval and all amendments to the plan. That was the condition. A number of things they indicated they would do on the final plan have not been done so they are not in compliance. You need to decide two things, are they in compliance? If there are fine, if they are not, then you need to decide what you are going to do. I'm hearing from the board you want to continue to work with them. Kirtland has been up front in the entire process, and a willing participant in the citizen committee, taken proactive measures, would agree the right way to go is to allow them to continue. You need to recognize that they made obligations, admitted that things did not work out the way they said. Does the Planning commission need to look at the permit and adjust it and work with them to come up with objective standards that we can live with as a community. Both parties have to agree to any amendments to the plan.

Board discussed reasons they felt Kirtland was not in compliance such as noise,

odor, landscaping issues, emissions, and public health and safety.

Kozlowski moved, Ellwanger seconded, that Kirtland Products, LLC is not in compliance with the Conditional Use Permit based on the following factors:

- Sound produced by the plant exceeds levels represented to the Planning Commission,
- The sound abatement and landscaping measures as proposed by Kirtland and approved for the conditional use final site plan have not been completed as all equipment exceeding 40dB was not placed inside the building,
- Landscaping as shown and described in the final approved development plan has not been installed,
- Concerns for public health, safety or welfare by reason of excessive production of traffic, noise, smoke, odors or other such nuisance.

Board has found them not in compliance, discussion revolved around what the next step is going to be.

Kozlowski – When are test emissions coming in?

Tom Monley – Kirtland – Expect them within 2 to 3 weeks. We want to take the work that has already been done to evaluate the impact that it has had on the noise, then come up with objective criteria that can be used to determine what needs to be done next, and work towards those goals.

Kozlowski – Would like to give them time to continue, but don't want to stretch out too long.

Quandt – You have to give us some thing objective to meet. Outside fans that are over 40dB can't go inside, that is their purpose is to be exhaust fans.

Kozlowski – Try to help set some type of limit to achieve these standards. You stated 24dB at the property line. EPA/DEQ sets a standard, the city has an ordinance that you have to abide by, I would think that is your standards.

McCahan – There is no objective standard in town. Can appreciate that they need to have something to measure by. Maybe the City, Kirtland and the citizens committee can get together to try to come up with standards. The RSG report suggested 40dB; maybe also could limit to 35 at night, other cities who do have definable noise limits have standards of 50 to 55dB at night. Also to mitigate the low frequency noises.

McPherson – They would like to re-evaluate after they complete all the Kodiak Group's recommendations. Once that is done, they can come back to the city and let us know what they have. If they want they can propose to the Planning Commission an amendment to their plan, or bring it in to compliance. Must be agreed upon by both parties. You can send it back to them to do the evaluation, meet with the city to tell us where they are, and determine what the objective standards they should meet.

McCahan – The limit of 24dB is probably impossible to meet. We need to come up with something. Propose maybe 30 days to get discussions going, and 60 days to

evaluate it.

MacKenzie - I want to look at the reduction 125/250 hertz, and overall noise levels of 40 dB or less, and work on pulsation and hums.

Neidhamer - There is going to be discussion with the lawyers, and negotiations of items that they promised us, the bottom line, it has to work in the city's favor. If they come back to us and say there is something that is not practical to be done or they can't decouple the machine, could be negotiated as long as they solve the problem of noise. The World Health Organization standards were recommended by RSG which is 40dB at night at the receiving place. There is going to be a process to work through, and it is going to take some time maybe the next 30 to 60 days.

McPherson - To do the evaluation, get a third party in to do analysis, it will take at a minimum of 30 days; 60 days would be more practical.

McCahan - Maybe put limits on times of operations to give the residence a break, until we can confirm the sound levels are down to what we expect.

MacKenzie - What restrictions are they under?

McPherson - They are under no restrictions, they are self imposed hours of operations to alleviate some of the problems. As the staff or City Commission we had no ability to tell them what to do, they made those requests, and we worked with them.

Crum - The mechanical work was stated to be completed within 2 weeks, what is the anticipated dB level when that is completed?

McPherson - It was not anticipated, but a re-evaluation was going to take place.

Crum - Is there a model of what expectations will be once done?

Monley - The intent of the modifications was the number one concern of RSG it wasn't a noise level reduction, but to get rid of the pulsation. Worked on the system to get rid of that, nothing to do with dB drop. 90% complete with that, one piece left to be done this week. Then an evaluation of the elimination of the pulsation. The pulsation was the fingerprint to allow people to know that Kirtland was running.

Frasz - While waiting for the data, is it beneficial to meet with our attorney to get a feel on how we might word something relating to what we just passed on the non compliance, and address those issues? Get the recommendation from engineers, council and staff, so we are clear on what has to be met, and we agree with it. That could be done within 30 days, and gather information back. The board agrees with this. Discuss maybe a limitation of hours of operation?

Leon Tupper - Kirtland - A restriction of hours at this time would be a severe economic disadvantage to the business. From the beginning, we have been accommodating and recognizing the necessary modification required before the start of the season. We recognize the level of concerns from the residents. DEQ standards, as far as we are concerned, we will be within them. If we do not operate around the clock, we operate inefficiently.

Monley - It is hard on the equipment with start up and shut down cycles. The manufacturer even states this. Look at limiting the number of days, and not the hours for the equipment.

McCahan - Can you operate 3 days a week and be happy?

Monley - Would prefer to work 3 days 24 hours, instead of limited hours 5 days a week. One day a week we schedule maintenance, so already shut down. Have been running 24 hours a couple days a week for a couple of weeks, due to stack testing. Looking for objective standards.

MacKenzie - Would we get RSG to come back, or someone more local?

McPherson - A qualified expert to give independent analysis is what is needed.

Neidhamer - Who is responsible to make the tests for dB? The City or is it their responsibility?

McPherson – The city did fund the RSG study to the cost of almost \$15,000. Kirtland should bear some responsibility for the costs to evaluate, but we need to have input on who does that evaluation.





Below are new operating points that maintain the flows you have now but at lower operating pressures.

FC-13 on 125030 Reduce RPM from 2950 to approx. 2583**
4328 cfm at 16" wc

This will require redesigning/replacing the fan inlet box and adding bell mouth inlet fittings on the pellet feed pipe eductors as we discussed on site.

FC-13W16 on 115035 Reduce RPM from 2730 to approx. 2476**
4344 cfm at 11" wc
Add splitter vane in inlet elbow.

FC-19 on 125050 Reduce RPM from 1969 to approx. 1837**
3388 cfm at 17" wc
Add splitter vane in inlet elbow.

FC-21 on 140010 Speed is OK as is.

Add splitter vane in the inlet elbow.

FC-26 on 105030 Reduce RPM from 1390 to approx. 1231**

6,000 cfm at 14" wc

Make sure the outlet duct is clear of dust build-up.

Reducing the fan rpm and adjusting the outlet dampers to full open will lower the noise levels and save on energy cost.
**Kice Industries (the OEM) should be consulted for new drive sheave combinations that will achieve the performances given above.

Other duct system design issues may also be contributing to the need for high pressure/rpm fans. We would like the opportunity to review the design of all of your air handling systems if possible.
The likely outcome of such a study would provide you with an understanding of the options and costs associated with improvements that could be made.
If you can forward detailed drawings of the ductwork systems provided to you we could begin that process immediately.

Re: Kirtland Products' Special Use Permit

Dear Planning Commissioners:

My family lives in Boyne City, a few blocks southeast of downtown. We have been very fortunate to live for six years in this beautiful town in this beautiful part of the world.

Since Kirtland Products began operations, my family's sense of safety in our community has diminished significantly. When Kirtland operates its plant and the wind blows from the east – or even when it is calm – we smell the plant's emissions in our yard and surrounding neighborhood. It is most unsettling to know that we are breathing air (once pure) that I believe now poses a health and safety threat. Many a lovely night I have had to shut my children's bedroom windows in an attempt to keep the outside air from entering. Of even greater concern, my children -- along with 1300 other children in the Boyne City schools – breathe the plant's emissions while attending school.

I understand that the government may have levels it considers "safe" for pellet plant emissions, and that testing of Kirtland's emissions may be occurring at this time. Still, in my mind there can be no safe level of emissions from a pellet plant located right next to an educational setting in which children play outside during recess.

My family earns its income in Boyne City. My wife is a physician at the Boyne Area Medical Center. Until recently I operated a law practice in Boyne City, a business I intend to reopen in 2-3 years. My wife and I believe in living and spending where we earn. We gladly shop in Boyne City, enjoy its restaurants and ice cream stores, and pay property taxes to support our excellent schools and parks. However, should Kirtland continue to operate its plant, our absolute obligation to guard the health of our children will compel us to move from Boyne City to one of the communities nearby. Because we would be living elsewhere, my wife and I would naturally spend our Boyne-based earnings in that other community. Our community activism and involvement as citizens would also naturally be directed toward that other community. My family loves Boyne City. We do not want to move. Kirtland's continued operation here would effectively bar us from staying.

That is my family's story, and I suspect it is also the story of many other Boyne City families. The story exposes the hard economic and social reality a small town must face

when a pellet plant is allowed to operate near that town's population center and schools.
I urge you to squarely face that reality as you act in regard to Kirtland's use permit.

I hear it over the television and other appliances and there is no where in my home to get away from it. I have had many sleepless nights.

This week it was louder. I notice a rhythmic shaking sound now coming for the plant when I take my dog for a walk. The plant wakes me up at least 3 times when it's operating at night. I am thankful for air conditioning as I need to keep all the windows closed.

I work 12 hour shifts at Charlevoix Area Hospital and I started noticing shortly after Kirtland opened that when I come home I began to smell the odor from the plant in Horton Bay which triggers an allergic reaction and got worse the closer I got to home.

I have been a Respiratory Therapist for 37 years. In doing research I have found out that that the smoke, vapors and dust from the pellet plant industry are extremely unhealthy for everyone, especially for children. When I drive by the school and see the children out at recess and see the plume, I just can't believe that everyone thinks that's o.k. Maybe not today or next week, but what about in five or ten years of being exposed to this. There are children and adults in the community who already reporting worse breathing problems when the plant is running. If the city cannot take care of us than who can? It's my understanding that the DEQ testing is this week. Please remember that even if this comes back showing the emissions are within the limits, those limits were set in my opinion and others are very high for the plants location.

The plume from the pellet plant is shameful to Boyne City landscapes. If you check out You Tube under Boyne City Pellet plant you will see what we mean. If you still allow the Pellet Plant to run in spite of them violating the terms of the **CONDITIONAL** use permit, who will invest in the area with the huge plume spewing noxious vapors and dust, the annoying noise, knowing that there is no one you will protect the rights of the homeowner and near-by businesses?

I hear and smell the plant whenever it is in operation. It has impacted every aspect of my life in a very detrimental way. I cannot go outside to maintain my property in which I have invested my life savings. The plant has turned my life from peaceful sanity into

insanity. There is no where in my home to get away and rest from the noise.

I implore the Planning Board to engage the Pellet Plant to abide by the Conditional Use Permit. As I read the permit it's so obvious that they are in violation of many of these conditions and this permit should be pulled.

Please protect me and the other citizens of Boyne who are so adversely affected. Please protect our property values. If you as a board allow Kirtland more wasteful time, my life and others will remain in nervous uncertainty. I foresee trying to sell my home at a loss and move from this once beautiful community.

Please stand firm and enforce the rules and regulations of the Conditional Use Permit. I and everyone else supports jobs in Boyne but with the guidelines to live harmoniously and protected.

No more precious time.

Dear Planning Commission Board Members,

As a member of the Boyne City Planning Commission you have the responsibility of overseeing the conditional use permit that was granted to Kirkland Products. As stated by our planning director Mr. McPherson, Kirkland Products is in violation of the conditions of the permit that was granted by your board. As you are aware conditional use permits are not an automatic right defined in the zoning ordinance. It is a right based on the conditions defined by the permit.

It has been suggested by a few that the facility was built in the (PID) Planned Industrial District therefore it should be tolerated as built. That is contrary to the zoning that has been reviewed and adopted by the Planning Commission, City Commission, and citizens as a whole. The PID has very clear restrictions and requirements as to how it affects the residents and property owners immediately outside its district. Kirkland has ignored and violated specific conditions some of which are as follows:

- The conditional use is so deigned, located and proposed to be operated that the public health, safety and welfare will be protected.
- The conditional use will not cause injury to the value of other property in the neighborhood in which it is to be located.
- The conditional use will protect the natural environment, help conserve natural resources and energy, and will not involve uses, activities, processes, materials, and equipment or conditions of operation that will be detrimental to the natural environment, public health, safety or welfare by reason of excessive production of traffic, noise, smoke, odors or other such nuisance.
- Sufficient landscaping, fencing, walls and other means of buffering are provided to insure that operation of the use will not be objectionable to nearby uses or dwellings by reason of noise, fumes or flash of lights nor interfere with an adequate supply of light and air, nor increase the danger of fire or otherwise create the potential of endangering the public safety.

As I am sure you are aware but let this serve as a reminder for the purpose of the Planned Industrial District.

Sec. 14.10.

The planned industrial district (PID) is intended to accommodate the industrial needs of the entire community in such a manner that the full range of development opportunities exists in a setting which is compatible and acceptable with the surrounding property owners. The further intent of this article is to encourage certain industries which are of a light manufacturing, research, warehousing and wholesaling character to locate in a planned area of the city whose physical effects are restricted to the district and in no manner affect in a detrimental way any of the surrounding districts or uses. The PID is intended for the manufacturing, compounding, processing, packaging, assembly, and or treatment of finished or semi-finished products from previously prepared material. The processing of raw materials for shipment in bulk for, or to be used in an industrial operation at another location are discouraged in the PID. In order that such uses may be integrated with nearby land uses, such as commercial and residential uses, limitations are placed upon the degree of noise, smoke, glare, waste, and other features of industrial operations so as to avoid adverse effects.

In closing, people have suggested that this facility needs to remain open because of jobs when in fact the focus should be on whether they are in compliance with the established zoning ordinance that has been adopted by our city.

Dear Planning Commission Board Members:

My name is Diane Hausler. My husband Mike and I live on Cozy Nook Lane just off State Street which is approximately 1 1/2 miles directly across the river from Kirkland. We have lived here at this same location and paid city taxes since 1976. Also, we've owned and operated a business in downtown Boyne City for 30 years.

We picked Cozy Nook Lane carefully for its peaceful country setting and beautiful view of the hillside looking across the river. Since Kirtland came to town last winter it's no longer peaceful and on many days there is no view of the hillside.

We first became aware of the noise as soon as Kirtland began operation. We could hear it in the house over the television and other appliances. Some days are worse than others depending on the wind. Yesterday morning it sounded very much like a jet plane getting ready to take off. Today is the same. If the new sound equipment has been installed, it is not noticeable. At first it was just about the noise.

Then we began to notice the odor.. We found it necessary to keep the windows closed not only because of the noise but because of the smell. In talking with Kirtland they said there wasn't anything they could do about the odor as it was just the by-product of the wood they are using and it is not harmful. We have since found out from health experts that there are very serious health risk associated with these odors, especially especially for children. Even if the DEQ report comes back below the allowed limits, the odor will always be here and get worse as time goes on.

The plume from our home looks like an atomic bomb. On many days it totally blocks the view of the hills and just hangs in the valley. On those days the odor is worse. Please look at my video on you tube under Boyne City Pellet Plant. I think you'll agree that the conditional use WILL cause injury to the value of not only our home but to many others as well.

Mike and I and others have been doing a great deal of research in regards to Pellet Plant Manufacturing. and we believe that Kirtlands location is ALL WRONG, and we don't believe that they decided on that location to provide jobs in Boyne. It was strictly a financial decision as they already owned the property. So now we are paying the consequences.

We were not present when Kirtland gave their presentation to you in 2008 but we have listened to the CD and read the transcripts. Contrary to what was said, THE EMISSIONS ARE NOT JUST CO2 AND WATER, THERE IS A VERY ANNOYING AND UNPLEANT AND UNHEALTHY ODOR, THE NOISE DOES NOT SOUND LIKE TWICE RUSTLING LEAVES, AND THE PLUME IS MUCH MUCH LARGER THAN TWICE THE SIZE OF LEXIMAR.

As Mr. McPherson has stated early on, Kirtland is in violation. We have gone through the appropriate solution process. It's time to stand firm and enforce the rules and regulations that are in place. More time is not the answer.

I'm writing with hopes of bringing your attention in regards to Kirtlands Pellet Plant and the affects on our life since its operation.

I'd like to begin with an introduction into my life, in hopes of bringing light to our cause.

I was born and raised in Northern Michigan, worked at our family owned service station in Petoskey at the age of 12 until I graduated from Harbor Springs High School in 1984. I then entered the USAF and served as an Aircraft Maintenance Specialist. I am now a former decorated Sergeant of the USAF and now a DAV forced into retirement due to Disabilities incurred while serving. I have obtained two degrees, Associates of Arts from NCMC of Petoskey and my BFA, Kendall College of Art & Design of Grand Rapids.

In 2004 my wife and I moved into a rental within the city limits of Boyne City. We spent the next 4 years searching (our real estate agent could easily attest to the many houses we looked at) and trying to decide where to call our home. During our 4 year journey which took us to many locations, of which a few even included where I had grown up as a child and as a graduate of Harbor Springs. A few of the showings were very tempting and we would be left with making some tough decisions. After we discussed the many options, we always came back hoping our home would be in Boyne City. Finally in 2008 that hope and opportunity became reality with the purchase of our home.

In the beginning our home life in Boyne was questionable at best. The home needed some remodeling, so we hired a local builder, who was from Boyne City. He unfortunately turned out to be a crook, failure to pay his subs, and overall a major headache, but we persevered to the best of our ability thanks to the support of others within Boyne City, who proved to us, not all were going to be as one who we had encountered. We made the decision to chalk it up to one of life's lessons like many new homeowners do, and with thanks to the supportive assistance of more reliable residents, helped prove to us we had made the right choice by sticking with Boyne City. We finally moved into our home late October of 2009. The next two years aside from our first initial hurdle, finally appeared to be on the upswing for us.

Then in the fall, October/November of 2011 it all changed. It started out with my going outside for an early morning deer hunt, only to hear a horrible sound, of which consisted of a loud squelching and a constant, ear and mind numbing drone that brought on nausea, headache and irritation to where it became unbearable. I thought initially that it was the snow machines of Boyne Mountain, and so I tried my best, at first, to be tolerant of it and hoped I'd only have to endure the discomfort until the first real snow fall, understanding of their business I'd settle on a self compromise. Snow fell and the drone continued. I was then informed while watching a huge plume cascading from the tree line to our south from across the Boyne River, that it was not Boyne Mountain, but the existence of a new plant, Kirtland Wood Pellet Plant.

I initially thought, all right, I'll give it a couple weeks, new business new bugs to work out, the city couldn't possibly expect this to be acceptable and would have it brought into better control, and again, I settled on a self compromise.

I then learned that this was to be my life 24hrs. for the duration of Kirtland Products existence or mine.

Today, September 6 2012, the drone is back. I had hoped to tend to a few outdoor needs around our home, it all had to be put on hold as I once again after being exposed for less than 20 minutes, became nauseated and could feel my nerves being pushed beyond my comfort level forcing me to seek refuge inside my home, only to no avail as the low sub frequency sound radiates through the walls.

We have a home that requires maintenance, to wit we had a new roof installed July 2012, which employed a local contractor and several local persons of Boyne City. We own vehicle(s) mow our lawn, snow blow in the winter, add to which we buy our gas in Boyne City and more importantly, we receive our healthcare needs within Boyne City. The choice of my wife and I made to make my retirement here, makes us a viable investment to the local economy.

It is our hope to continue, in this manner. It is difficult to think our options have become so limited because of a bad decision, in lieu of misinformation, therefore making for a bad decision in the allowance for the operation of the Kirtland Plant.

I can't imagine you, yourself, volunteering to having your home life impeded with a constant noise and a drone that drives you to nausea.

You and the board have an opportunity to correct the oversight, made by allowing this plant to operate. I know, there is no way you would want your home life filled with what ours now has to endure, if it were here from the beginning, in making our choice for a location to call home, Boyne City would never had been even considered as an option...NEVER.

We continue to hope for better from the leaders of the community.

Dear Gretchen,

In August 2008, my wife, Jody, and I wanted to see another grocery store come back to Boyne City. We refinanced our home, along with our retirement and invested in the old Carter's building. We thought the lease was up but it was renewed for another five years which put us on hold to move forward. When the lease is up I hope to pursue this dream of getting another grocery store in Boyne.

Just after we purchased the Old Carter's Building, the owners of the building adjacent to us, now Kirtland Products, were looking to see if they could get approval to put a wood pellet plant in that location. Times were tough and jobs were welcomed with opened arms. The idea of a wood pellet plant seemed to be a good idea.

We didn't have a problem with it. **After all, the zoning was light manufacturing and in no manner would be allowed to effect in a detrimental way the surrounding districts or uses. Sec.14.10 of the PID zoning**

So on November 17, 2008 the Planning Board met regarding Kirtland's application for a conditional use permit. Because this really wasn't a light industry it needed a special use permit to make sure it would fit in the location.

Here are some of the questions you asked at that meeting:

#1. What would be coming out of the stacks?

The answer was "**just Co2 and water**".

What they didn't tell us was that there would also be **volatile organic compounds (VOC's) and particulate matter making up the remaining portion**. For example, particulate matter is things floating around in the air. Most of them you cannot even

see. They are a kind of air pollution called particles or particulate matter. In fact, particulate matter may be the air pollutant that most commonly affect people's health. We are relying on the DEQ to tell us if there is a safe level of this coming out of the stacks. Their model is based on other wood pellet plants that are further out of town not next to neighborhoods and schools. In an article written about another wood pellet plant in Canada said **"that there are no safe levels of particulate matter air pollution"**. **Society as a whole has a shared responsibility to take care of the air we breathe.**

The plant was in Burns Lake Canada 12 miles outside of town. They were made to install two micro-mist scrubbers because the town was so afraid that the **particulate matter** would carry into their town **12 miles away**. Our wood pellet plant is in the **city limits**. I do believe that if the applicant would have said that there will be **these types of emissions** coming out of the stack that the Planning Board would have tabled it for further study.

#2. What about odor?

The answer was "we were at two other plants and **"didn't smell anything"** I believe the Planning Board felt that was sufficient to mean **(No Odor)**. There **is odor** and when the plant is running and when it is running 24 hours you can smell it in the Central Business District.

I believe the planning board would have had to table it for further study if they thought that there would be odor coming out. They did finally say at a later meeting that there would be some odor, but by then their permit was already granted.

#3. What about noise?

The applicant went into a very long and in depth discussion about how the decibels would be **"24 at the property line and 15 at the nearest house"**. They stated that it **would not be louder than Lexamar**. Any of the noisy equipment would be inside or **decoupled or have a building built around it**.

I believe that if the Planning Board had any indication that a wood pellet plant would make any noise louder than Lexamar **as they stated** they would have tabled it for further study. The applicant's last statement was **"WE WILL ABATE NOISE"**

#4. How large will the plume be? The answer was about **"twice the size of Lexamar"**. I've never noticed a plume coming from Lexamar.

I do believe that the Planning Board would have tabled the application for further study if they knew you could see the plume from Boyne Falls during the colder seasons.

The Planning Board **relied on the information and statements made by the applicants** in order to make their decision that this would or would not be a proper use in this location. The information **they provided** to get their permit **does not**

match up with what has ended up being the final product. They either **knew or should have known** what they were putting in Boyne City next to our **neighborhoods and schools system**.

The wood pellet plant that was built in Boyne City **does not even closely resemble** what **was approved**. And as a result of the building of this plant it has changed the character of the neighborhood and the community and is now what everyone sees when they first enter Boyne City.

Not only are they in violation on the noise aspect of the permit but because of their incorrect statements regarding emissions, odor, size of plume and inadequate berming they are also in violation in these areas.

Some are concerned about the applicant's investment and 12 jobs.

The question comes to mind. What about the investments and lifesaving of the surrounding property owners? A grocery store will employ as many people as the wood pellet plant, with no pollution. Plus we could use a store on that end of town. The neighbors that would like to sell but can't. Or will have to take a tremendous discount.


You asked all the right questions.

No safe level of PM emissions

What is the white plume coming from the Pinnacle Pellet plant near Burns Lake?

This is the question asked by many concerned locals.

According to Benjamin Weinstein, air quality meteorologist with the environmental protection division of the Ministry of Environment, Skeena region, the plume that is emitted from the Pinnacle Pellet plant comes from the drying of the pellet furnish, which consists mainly of sawdust and shavings.

"The majority of the plume is steam [moisture from the furnish], with volatile organic compounds (VOC's) and particulate matter making up remaining portion," he said.

The particulate matter includes hydrocarbons that condense to form small particles when the exhaust gas cools and this is what produces the visible haze.

"Before the permit to Pinnacle Pellet was issued, the company hired a consultant to undertake a dispersion modeling study to predict the maximum particulate matter concentrations from the pellet plant's emissions," he said.

The study results indicated that the highest concentrations from the plant [on a maximum daily and annual basis] will be near the plant and on adjacent hill sides.

"The model predicts a minimal particulate matter (PM) 2.5 concentration increase in Burns Lake," he said. [PM 2.5 refers to particles less than 2.5 micrometers in aerodynamic diameter]

Weinstein also said that the dispersion modeling study used maximum plant emissions as predictors and the decision to award a permit to Pinnacle Pellet for the Burns Lake plant was made based on maximum emissions rather than actual emissions. "Actual emissions can be considerably lower," he said.

Weinstein said that the Ministry of Environment issues permits on the basis that PM 2.5 emissions will not accumulate in a manner that would exceed provincial targets.

"These ambient air quality objectives were chosen based on the best science and information available at the time and are meant to be protective of human health and the environment, knowing that different parts of the population are affected by different concentrations of fine particles at different times and for differing durations. B.C. has some of the most stringent PM2.5 objectives in the world," he said.

However, he goes on to say that even though the pellet plant is located more than 20 kilometres away from Burns Lake, the dominant wind direction in the area is from the south-southeast and under certain meteorological conditions plant emissions may be carried towards Burns Lake.

For this reason Pinnacle Pellet installed two micro-mist scrubbers, one on each of the dryer stacks which significantly reduce PM emissions.

According to Weinstein, the Ministry of Environment is also working with Pinnacle Pellet on an air quality episode management plan which, when complete, will direct the plant to reduce their emissions during periods of poor air quality in Burns Lake.

"We will continue to monitor the air quality in Burns Lake, in part to validate the model claims. Pinnacle Pellet will also be contributing funds to the ambient air quality monitoring program that is already in place in Burns Lake and other parts of the Hwy. 16 corridor," he said.

Weinstein said to Lakes District News that the air quality monitoring program is run as a polluter pay style system whereby industrial polluters are required to pay into the Ministry of Environment fund based on the amount of emissions they make.

The higher the emission, the more contribution the business is required to pay.

"This is a requirement of the permitting process for all industry in the Bulkley Valley air shed," he said.

The fund then helps to pay for local air quality monitoring systems.

Currently pellet plant emissions are regulated by a permit that is issued by the Ministry of Environment's environmental protection program.

Weinstein said, "The emissions are monitored by third party qualified professionals who conduct stack samples using very sensitive equipment. Different pellet plant facilities are monitored on different frequencies based on a variety of factors, including location and past operational performance."

According to Weinstein, Pinnacle Pellet is currently required to sample on a quarterly basis, with extra samples collected upon start up of certain equipment to ensure optimum performance."

Pellet plant dryer emissions differ from beehive burner emissions because beehive burners burn wood residue rather than drying it.

"Burning the wood residue in beehive burners produced significant amounts of wood smoke, high concentrations of PM, poly cyclic aromatic hydrocarbons, VOC's and other chemicals and compound groups."

"There is no safe level of PM air pollution. Society as a whole has a shared responsibility to take care of the air we breathe. How we heat our homes, the vehicles we drive, what we do in our backyards and what industry emits are all contributing effects to the air we breathe," Weinstein added.

Leroy Reitsma, Pinnacle Pellet's chief operating officer previously spoke to Lakes District News [as published in Lakes District News edition of April 20, 2011] and addressed the concerns regarding plant emissions, saying that what people are seeing from the highway is the evaporation of water.

"The plant has been built using the best available technology and the concentration of emissions from the Burns Lake plant is similar to a plant that would be located in a heavily populated area," Reitsma added.

He went on to say that the Burns Lake plant is being held to a very high standard [for emissions] and is held to the same standard that is expected of the pellet plant in Prince George.
